ELECTRICAL FEE CHANGES JULY 1, 2022

Changes to Alternative Energy, Generators & Signs

The changes listed below are designed to standardize the permitting requirements with other jurisdictions and to breakout certain fees that simplify the process for contractors.

Alternative Energy (Wind, Solar) Installations will be based on the 'per watt' size of the array. The fees will be calculated from the labour and material schedule, based on the per watt calculated output of the array. This will include all labour and materials up to the point of interactive connection. Additional labour and materials to be permitted can be added as a separate line item on this permit.

Generators (Permanent) Installations will be permitted based on the 'per watt' rated size of the generator and will include all labour and material up to and including the transfer switch. Additional labour and material to be permitted can be added as a separate line item on this permit.

Generators (Temporary) Installations will be permitted at a flat rate. A temporary generator is one connected prior to the installation of permanent power. Temporary generators must be permitted each time they are installed at a different location. Additional labour and material to be permitted can be added as a separate line item on this permit.

Sign Installations will be permitted at a flat rate based on the type rather than their cost to build or supply. This cost will be inclusive of the sign and the wiring up to the first point of overcurrent protection. No other fees can be added to a sign permit. Signs cannot be added to a general labour and material permit.
